



Community service has greatly helped me develop soft skills such as communication and general management skills.

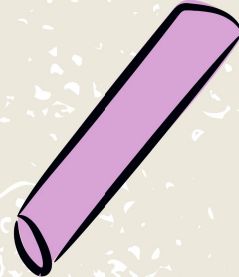
“I have always felt strongly about the issues regarding the environment and sustainability, be it climate change and recycling or animal welfare or resource wastage and management and more.”
