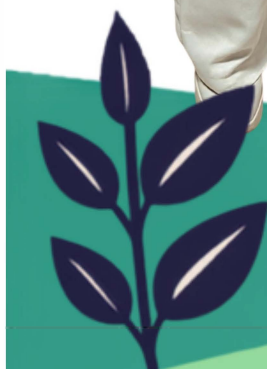
Volunteering was always something I wanted to do, but I often found reasons to put it off, such as focusing on my studies, adapting to a new job, or being busy with work commitments.

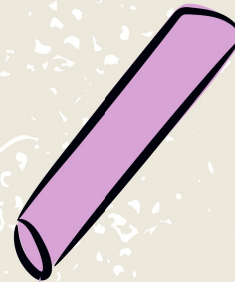
***“Serve with a heart to give, not to receive. Simple act of helping others can make a meaningful difference in someone's life and help build a stronger community.”***
